- 2. **FAST** Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal is permitted on this day.
- 3. TO DISREGARD completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

PALM SUNDAY: Next Sunday begins the Holiest Week for us as Christians. Christ enters into Jerusalem to acclamations of making Him "king." It turns into the Passion of our Lord. I hope to be able to stream live the Mass and then provide for drive thru only pickup of palms beginning at 5:00 pm Saturday at St. Mary's with families A-M coming 5-5:30 pm and N-Z 6-7 pm and then 9:00 am Sunday at St. Thomas with families A-G 9-9:30 am; H-P 9:30-10 am & Q-Z 10-10:30 am. I am trying to provide for the protection of people while enabling the celebration of our faith.

EASTER TRIDUUM: Please check the bulletin and/or emails or St. Thomas' and St. Mary's facebook pages for information as it becomes available for Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. While April 7 was the target date for resuming activity, the quarantine could be extended. Accordingly, the times of service and church opening for private reflection will be determined for each day.

If not able to celebrate public Mass/liturgy on those days, I plan to provide Holy Communion to our parishioners who request it.

LITURGICAL AND FAITH LIFE CHANGES DUE TO THE CORONAVIRUS in the DIOCESE OF SPRIGNFIELD IN ILLINOIS

Bishop Paprocki has asked us to increase, rather than decrease our prayer and fasting, in solidarity with our brothers and sisters locally, nationally, and worldwide. Below is a summary of changes and guidelines for changes in our shared faith life. These changes remain in effect until further notice.

Masses and the Obligation to attend are suspended for the people. Priests are to offer Mass "sine populo" (without People). All public Masses and liturgical celebrations are replaced by private Masses. Our Bishop asks you to enter into a Eucharistic fast, that is, (Spiritual communion) until further notice.

NOTE: For Catholics who hungers for the Bread of Life, and ask to receive Holy Communion, I will not deny them. Private reception of Holy Communion is requested by contacting Fr. Dean at 217-494-6326.

Private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle is available during the following hours:

- 5:30 am 9:00 pm at St. Thomas Church
- 8:00 am 3:00 pm at St. Mary's Church

Private individual prayers include rosary, stations of the cross, Scripture reading, meditation, etc. There is to be no public gathering scheduled.

REMINDER: Anointing of the Sick is reserved primarily for those in danger of death. Please call the parish office For Anointing of the Sick, Viaticum, the Last Rites, or Holy Communion, call or text 217-494-6326. Please leave a message and I will get back to you ASAP.

Funerals: Private funerals will continue to be offered, limited to the immediate family only, in keeping with the government restrictions regarding crowd size, with the option to schedule a public Memorial Mass at a future date. No visitations to be held in our Church at the present times regarding these government regulations.

CONFIRMATIONS / FIRST COMMUNION

MASSES are cancelled and a New Schedule is to be established when the "all clear is given for public gatherings." **Note:** We will have to reschedule for our future third graders.

Weddings: Regrettably, government guidelines and mandates impact most weddings. A wedding within the next month will need to be a private wedding mass, with only immediate family and two official witnesses.
